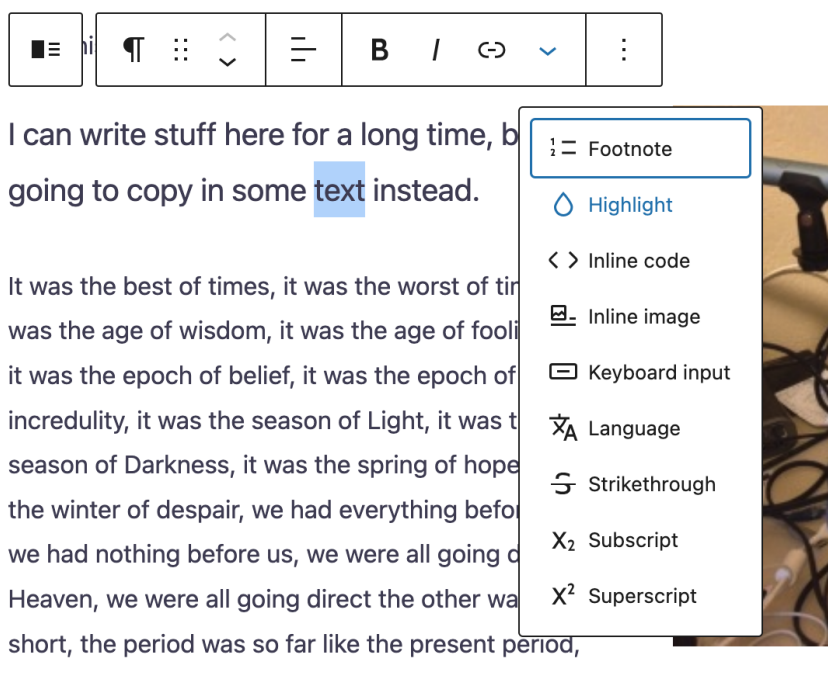
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Changing Text Color for an Entire Block

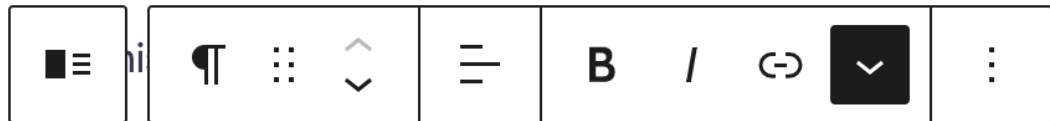
1. If it is not already on, open the settings panel on the right side of the editing page.
2. Put your cursor in the block for which you want to change the font color.
3. In the settings panel, click the text color button.
4. Select from among the text colors in the circles, or click the checkerboard box at the top of the dialog to choose from a larger variety of colors.
5. Click out of the color box to select the chosen color.

Changing color of a single word or phrase within a paragraph

1. Highlight the word or phrase that you wish to color.
2. Select the drop down arrow on the context menu.

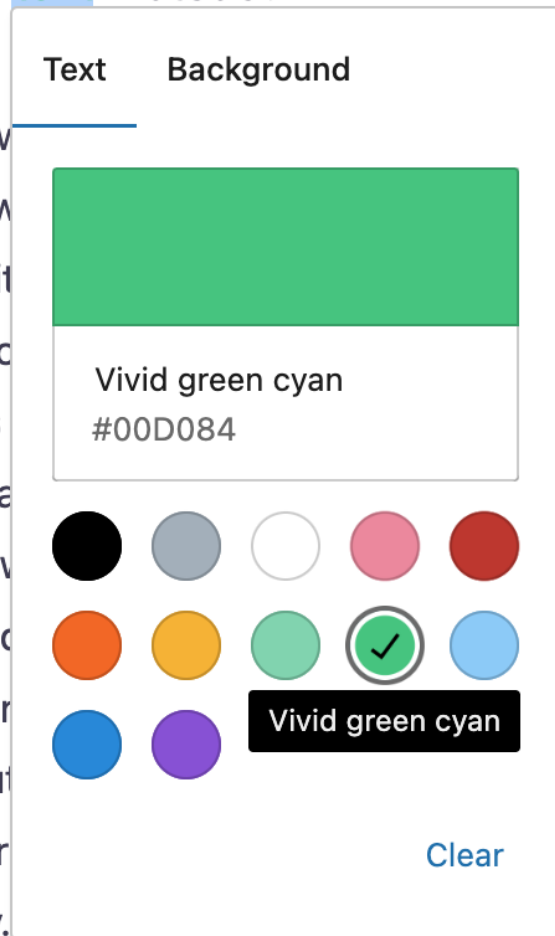


3. Select highlight, and then choose the color. To get a full range of colors, click in the box at the top of the dialog.
4. Click out of the color box to select the chosen color.



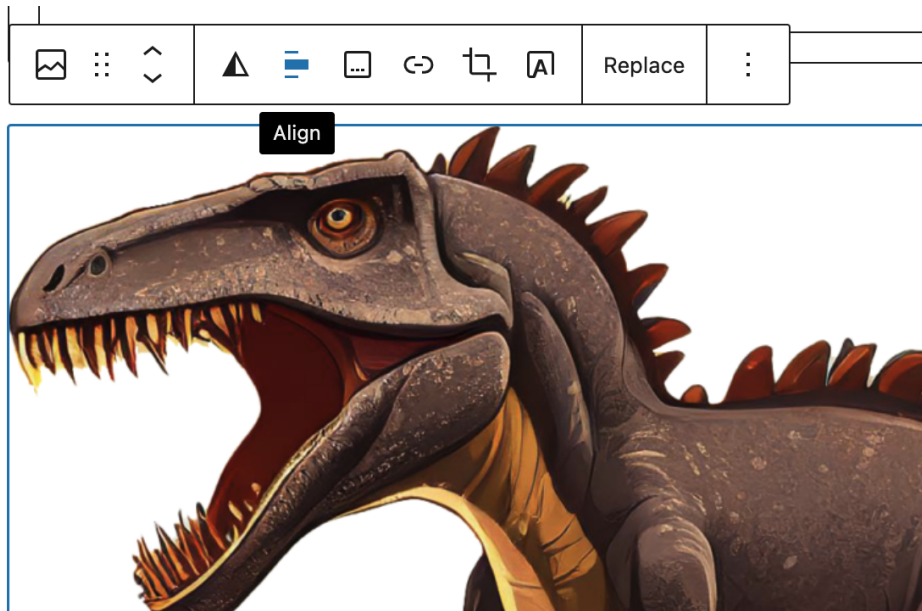

Word Wrap in WordPress

1. Create an image block, and add an image.
2. Enter a paragraph block below it and add the text.
3. Click on the image block, and select the align icon. Select left or right alignment.



4. Grab one of the sizing circles on the side or bottom of the image block and resize the image. The text will wrap as the image becomes smaller.
