Altering Characteristics for Titles Globally

This CSS code will center all page titles:

```
.entry-title {  
    text-align: center;  
}
```

This CSS code will alter other characteristics of page titles.

```
.entry-title {  
    color: #ff0000;  
    font-size: 60px;  
    text-align: center;  
}
```

Altering Title Attributes for Single Pages

How to Find a Page ID

Every page and post in WordPress is assigned a unique ID.² You can find this ID in the URL when you are editing a page in your WordPress dashboard.³ Look for the `post=` or `page_id=` parameter followed by a number. For example, in a URL like `https://yoursite.com/wp-admin/post.php?post=123&action=edit`, the page ID is **123**.

Using the Page ID in Custom CSS

Once you have the ID, you can write a CSS rule that targets only that specific page.⁴ WordPress automatically adds a unique class to the `<body>` tag of each page, typically in the format `.page-id-#` or `.postid-#`.⁵ You combine this class with the general selector for the page title (which is often `.entry-title` or `.page-title` depending on your theme) to create a specific CSS rule.

Here's a common example:

```
.page-id-123 .entry-title {  
  color: #ff0000;  
  font-size: 40px;  
}
```

In this code, .page-id-123 ensures that the CSS properties only apply to the page with an ID of 123. The .entry-title part targets the title itself.

You can add this code to the **Additional CSS** section in the WordPress Customizer (**Appearance > Customize > Additional CSS**).
